They thought I was joking but now they see me attending my placement regularly and they know I am serious.

Some of those ladies are now coming to the Business Education workshops and I encouraged them.

- Nothing much just farming.

*** How will the Nwanyichukwu projects help you?**

- As an apprentice, I am learning a skill in making soaps and detergents.

It will be very useful to me once I finish learning the skill.

I will have a skill to help myself, my family, my wider community.



*** How about the Life Skills & Business Education components?**

- I have learnt a lot of things

e.g. with business you will know when you are rising and falling in business, how to guide your business, the plan, The choices to make before you go ahead.

*** What will you say to others about the Nwanyichukwu projects?**

- There is a proverb that says where you go and get something good you tell your sister about it.

I am already telling everyone about it and encouraging others as I have learnt a lot..
